Franklin Noah Loper, Jr. (Frank) died peacefully on Saturday, April 3, 2021. He was 83. Frank was born in Dover, Delaware, son of Franklin Noah Loper, Sr. (1993) and Lucy Pearl Dickerson Loper (2006). He worked at the Dover Air Force Base for Air Mod rebuilding the engines on the 121C Super Constellation and at the New Castle County Airport for Capitol Airways servicing airplane engines. Frank was later employed by Burger Construction Company for many years and by George & Lynch. He served in the United States Army and was stationed in Germany. Frank was an accomplished water skier and loved boating with his family and friends. He was predeceased by his wife, Mary Anna Loper. Frank is survived by his son, Stephen F. 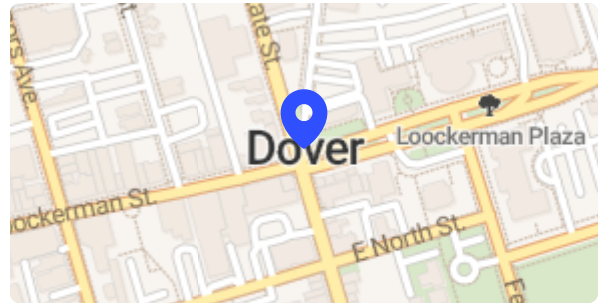
